ADVISING STUDENTS INTERESTED IN STUDY ABROAD

We encourage students to start planning early and to work with academic advisers to build study abroad into a four-year academic plan. Check out our <u>Frequently Asked Questions for Colleges & Advisors website</u> and share our <u>Getting Started handout</u> that provides a general step-by-step overview of the study abroad process.

For the majority of Marquette semester programs, students pay Marquette tuition and can use Marquette scholarships, federal and state financial aid. Students can apply to study abroad on a short-term program as early as the summer after freshman year. Students are encouraged to work with their college academic adviser to determine which term best fits into their four-year plan.

Study Abroad Fair

MARQUETTE STUDY ABROAD APPLICATION DEADLINES*

Students interested in pursuing a study abroad experience must apply in the semester prior to their intended term abroad.

- Spring study abroad: **October 1** (excludes semester programs in Spain)
 - » For Spring 2025 Spain semester study abroad, students must apply by: September 6 (<u>Marquette</u> spring application deadline for Spain semester study abroad is subject to change every vear)
- Spring Break study abroad abroad: November 15
- Summer, fall or academic year study abroad: March 1

Marquette <u>Nursing</u> students apply during sophomore year by **February 1** to participate on a <u>semester</u> study abroad experience in their fall or spring of junior year due to academic curriculum requirements. For short-term (j session, spring break and summer), nursing students follow the deadlines as indicated above.

ADVISING STUDENTS ACCEPTED TO STUDY ABROAD

Marquette has several programs in non-English-speaking countries where students can take an introductory course in the local language while taking other academic courses in English.

STUDY ABROAD CREDIT TRANSFER

There are designated individuals within each Marquette college that assist with study abroad course approvals. Students are required to complete a **study abroad course approval form** (CAF) prior to their study abroad departure from Marquette. Students should work with their college academic advisor(s) and the designated college contact for study abroad course approvals to determine Marquette course equivalencies for study abroad. STUDY ABROAD PLACEHOLDER COURSE ENROLLMENT

Outgoing study abroad students (exception: MU Law students studying abroad) are registered by the Office of International Education into a STIN study abroad placeholder course in CheckMarq prior to their departure. This typically occurs around the regular course enrollment period at Marquette. The STIN placeholder course designates a student as study abroad. For semester students abroad, the STIN placeholder course will also populate as the course which fulfills the Discovery Tier Elective on a student's graduation checklist.

Students do not need to enroll in Marquette courses during their course enrollment period for the term they are abroad. However, students should still meet with their college academic advisor(s) to discuss their academic plans as any registration holds should be resolved prior to the STIN enrollment process.

ADVISING STUDENTS CURRENTLY ABROAD

VERIFICATION OF COURSE ENROLLMENT FORM

Once abroad, students are required to complete the <u>verification of course enrollment</u> (VCE) form. The VCE form is completed by both the student and the host institution/provider to confirm course enrollment. This is to ensure that students are enrolled at the required full-time status with Marquette. This is completely separate from the course approval form (CAF).

COURSE ENROLLMENT FOR SUBSEQUENT TERM AT MARQUETTE

As students may be abroad during the term in which the subsequent term's enrollment period at Marquette is scheduled (likely for semester students abroad), college advising requirements may need to occur virtually.

Students should not need the Marquette VPN to access CheckMarq to enroll in Marquette courses while abroad, but we encourage students to have this installed on their computers in case any issues may arise. Students should be mindful of any time difference and plan accordingly.

ADVISING STUDENTS UPON RETURN TO CAMPUS

STUDY ARROAD CREDIT TRANSFER TIMELING

Following the end of a study abroad experience, it can take up to three months before the student's study abroad transcript is received at the Office of International Education. Once received, students will be notified and a copy uploaded into their **MUGlobal Portal**.

From the time the Office of International Education receives the study abroad transcript to when credits are posted to CheckMarq can be an additional two weeks. Missing or incomplete **study abroad course approval form** may delay this process.
