John Borg, P.E., Professor, Chair, Mechanical Engineering

Her research sits at the intersection of Latinx education, critical youth studies, and community-based education. Through critical ethnography and participatory methods, Dr. Ventura's research sheds light into the different ways in which community-based spaces and practices foster Latinx students' sense of belonging, academic identities, and critical consciousness. As a community-based researcher, Dr. Ventura prioritizes relationship building and the knowledges of Latinx communities in her work to build equitable and mutually beneficial research partnerships for social justice. Kimberly D'Anna-Hernandez, Ph.D., Associate Professor, Psychology

"Dr. Kimberly D'Anna Hernandez is an Associate Professor of Psychology. Her teaching, research and mentoring revolves around supporting minorities, especially women. She currently directs the new U-RISE at MU program, an NIH funded program designed to prepare and support undergraduate students majoring in STEM from underrepresented groups to enter and succeed in doctoral studies (Ph.D. or M.D. /Ph.D.) and careers in biomedical research. This is the first URISE grant of its kind in the Midwest! Dr. D'Anna Hernandez's research is community-based and focuses on the role of stress-related hormones on maternal behavior, and the role of acculturation and discrimination and other psychosocial measures on the biological response to stress in pregnant women, particularly Mexican and Mexican-American women. She teaches Health Disparities: A Biopsychological Perspective that examines the biological underpinnings of health disparities. Khadijah 'Gigi' Makky, Ph.D., Clinical Professor, Biomedical Sciences

Jax Sanders, Ph.D., Assistant Professor, Physics

"Jax Sanders grew up in Farmington Hills, MI. They have a B.A. in Physics and Mathematics from Kalamazoo College, and a M.S. and a Ph.D. in Physics from University of Michigan. They design subsystems for gravitational wave interferometers and work to design new detectors to expand the scope of the new field of gravitational wave astronomy. They worked at LIGO Hanford Observatory as an Advanced LIGO commissioner, installing and characterizing the sensing and control systems that keep the complex optical system aligned. After getting their Ph.D. at University of Michigan, they worked at Syracuse University as a postdoc, where they became involved with conceptual design for future interferometers. Jax has two interesting distinctions in their field: they're the last person to publish a gravitational wave thesis that doesn't mention the first detection of gravitational waves, and they're the first person to get a tattoo of the GW150914 black hole inspiral signal(it's on their left forearm, ask if you want to see it!). When they're not doing physics, they enjoy fencing, art, Dungeons and Dragons, and video games - particularly platformers and RPGs!"
