

FUNDING OPPORTUNITY FOR FACULTY

ADVANCE is currently in no-cost-extension (through September 30, 2023) & we have funds available for faculty travel to conferences for the purpose of networking for longer-range potential faculty recruitment. This could potentially involve attendance at a disciplinary meeting where there are committees or special interest groups - for example the Committees on the Status of Women in Physics & Minorities in Physics at the March 2023 American Physical Society meeting - or meetings sponsored by organizations focused on diversity in STEM/SBE such as SACNAS.

The expectation would be that the faculty member attends the meeting & actively networks with colleagues, brings back insights, & share their experience with others in the Marquette community (we will host some panel discussions or ADVANCE socials for this purpose). This is a great opportunity to support a faculty member who may not be presenting at a meeting but who would benefit from attending or to also provide additional conference attendance support for high-performing faculty. Given the focus of ADVANCE on faculty, this opportunity is restricted to faculty (tenured/tenuretrack/participating).

DR. ROGER GREEN LEADS MEN ALLIES WORKSHOP

November 17 & 18, 2022 - Advocates & Allies hosted the 2022 Men Allies for Gender Equity workshop, led by Dr. Roger Green (Professor of Electrical & Computer Engineering at North Dakota State University).



The group discussed why allyship is important to gender equity, as well as practiced scenarios where men could speak up in situations where behavior should not be tolerated. Nine (9) men were in attendance, including Senior Vice Provost for Faculty Affairs, Gary Meyer.

Dr. Cris Ababei (Associate Professor of Electrical & Computer Engineering & leader of Advocates & Allies) hopes to use Dr. Green's workshop as a template for Marquette Advocates to lead their own future workshops.
