# **AMP:** ADDRESSING THE POST-AWARD PROCESS FOR MARQUETTE FACULTY

AMP (ADVANCEing Marquette Priorities) held a workshop in February regarding the post-service award process for faculty receiving grants. Before the event, a survey was sent to all ADVANCE department faculty, where 22 anonymous survey participants chose their TOP 3 PRIORITIES:

user-friendly monthly account reporting (1)

(2) centralized campus forms for post-grant support

(3) timeframe for establishing new accounts

Faculty and staff from 11 departments came together at the 707 HUB to provide constructive feedback and devise solutions to the barriers that the current post-award process imposes. Participants split into groups and rotated throughout the room to write down their suggestions for the three priority issues listed above. Afterward, the group reconvened and prioritized action items that will include: an AMP follow-up event on current account reporting tools; development of centralized website materials that feature process diagrams and responsibility matrices for materials that feature process diagrams and responsibility matrices for post-award services and responsibilities of a new post-award services hire in ORSP.
