ADVANCE Spotlight



Dr. Kimberly D'Anna Hernandez is an Associate Professor of Psychology. Her teaching, research and mentoring revolves around supporting minorities, especially women. She currently directs the new U-RISE at MU program, an NIH funded program designed to prepare and support undergraduate students majoring in

STEM from underrepresented groups to enter and succeed in doctoral studies (Ph.D. or M.D. /Ph.D.) and careers in biomedical research. This is the first URISE grant of its kind in the Midwest! Dr. D'Anna Hernandez's research is community-based and focuses on the role of stress-related hormones on maternal behavior, and the role of acculturation discrimination and other psychosocial and measures on the biological response to stress in pregnant women, particularly Mexican and Mexican-American women. She teaches Health Disparities: A Biopsychological Perspective that examines the biological underpinnings of health disparities.
