

ABOUT IWL

The Institute for Women's Leadership (IWL) builds upon the university's historic role as the first Catholic university in the world to co-educate undergraduate women beginning in 1909. In January 2019 during his fifth presidential address, President Lovell announced the creation of the IWL, made possible through a generous \$5 million endowment by the Thomas J. Rolfs Family Foundation. The support for IWL and the Women's Innovation Network (WIN) pilot project was facilitated by the advocacy of Marquette alumna Claire Rolfs in partnership with University VP of Research and Innovation, Dr. Jeanne Hossenlopp.

MISSION

The mission of the IWL at Marquette University is to advance women's leadership locally and globally through pioneering research, innovative programming, and collaborative engagement.

VISION

The vision of the IWL is one of intersectional inclusivity and gender equity. As advocates for justice, we will engage, inspire, and transform students, faculty, staff, and community leaders.

RESEARCH ENVIRONMENT

Over the 2023-2024 year, IWL supported innovative research across multiple disciplines as well as programming that highlighted gender and leadership-related research topics. IWL funded eight small grants that provided researchers with seed funding to pilot, kick-start, or support projects through its Mini-Grant program, as well as larger grants. The 2023 IWL Interdisciplinary Summer Grants provided an opportunity for teams of scholars to collaborate on a gender-related project, which they then presented during a Fall 2023 IWL Research Social.







In November 2023, Jennica Webster, PhD, completed her work, "Milwaukee Women in the Workplace—2023 Report," and presented it to the community via a Tempo Talks event. This paper reviews findings from her study of workers in the Milwaukee metropolitan area and provides recommendations on how the Milwaukee community can continue to make equitable advancements towards an even better community.





Launching a new community research partnership, this past year IWL collaborated with Milwaukee Women inc (MWi) on a project related to MWi's annual report about the number of women on corporate boards: https://www.milwaukeewomeninc.org/research/. IWL and MWi will partner again in 2024 on this important initiative.

Finally, IWL led two cohorts of IWL Faculty Fellows. These fellows participated in a research community over the course of a semester, meeting regularly and providing support to one another on their individual projects. An IWL white paper, "Research and Storytelling as Gendered Resistance," was published from the work of the Fall 2023 cohort.



LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMMING

IWL's leadership development programming focused on three main areas: skills workshops, expansion of the IWL Student Advisory Board, and fostering career development through paid internships.

Over the 2023-2024 academic year, IWL offered a variety of engaging and insightful events tailored to enhance women's leadership skills. Highlights included the following:

- Connect with Confidence: Networking for Introverts Workshop, presented by Jazmynn Appleton
- WISDOM Brunch featuring Engineering & Non-Profits, where women in these sectors shared successful strategies in male-leadership dominated fields, planned by IWL's Student Advisory Board—IWL's WISDOM Series, or Women In STEM/SBE Departments Of Marquette, is an ongoing rotation of gatherings that focus on different disciplines and areas of interest in STEM and SBE science fields.
- TEMPO Talks presentation that featured findings from the "Milwaukee Women in the Workplace" study led by former IWL Director Jennica Webster, PhD
- "What's Empowerment?" Discussion with Marquette's Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc., and Omicron Gamma chapter of Sigma Lambda Gamma National Sorority, Inc.
- **Negotiation Workshop with Kristie Rogers, PhD**, co-hosted with Marquette University's *Women in Business* student organization

These programs collectively drew over 180 participants who left with new skills and perspectives ready to be applied in their leadership journeys.



In its second year, the IWL Student Advisory Board (IWL SAB) continued to grow with the mentorship of IWL's new Leadership Development Coordinator X'Zandria Weil. Expanding into the Milwaukee community, the IWL SAB volunteered at PEARLS for Teen Girls' Inspired to Lead 2024, supporting PEARLS' intersectional efforts to advance leadership development and opportunities in youth and expanding IWL's reach and community connections. With seasoned student advisory board members welcoming new students, the energy of this year's IWL Student Advisory Board enhanced IWL's work toward its mission to empower and support women leaders.

For the 2023-2024 academic year and the fifth year of the program, IWL supported two internship positions that focused on assisting with IWL events, marketing, and various administrative elements. This program continues to empower students with invaluable skills and experiences, reinforcing IWL's commitment to nurturing the next generation of leaders.

MARKETING

During 2023-2024, IWL boosted its marketing and social media efforts in various ways to continue to strengthen IWL community connections while also expanding the IWL network.

As a result, IWL's mailing list increased to 1,926 contacts and had a 24.08% increase in traffic to IWL digital marketing sites (*i.e.*, e-newsletters, event registrations, and mailing list subscription webpage) from the 2022-2023 fiscal year.

IWL's impact in social media also grew significantly—overall IWL's audience grew to 2,709 combined followers across all four of IWL's social media platforms:
